Our **Annual Talent Show is TODAY** at 6:30 p.m. Come see our talented members and eat ice cream!



Mission trip to southwestern Virginia, Oct 6-12: AUMC is sponsoring an adult mission trip to Jonesville, VA, to help with the Appalachian Service Project (ASP). Typical ASP projects include roofing, drywall and insulation, wheelchair ramps, plumbing, electrical repairs, foundation repair, painting, and stair and floor repairs. Cost for the week: \$450, including transportation, lodging, meals and all construction materials. Cost for a partial week (three days): \$300. 
