<u>Station 2</u>	Jesus, betrayed by Judas, is arrested	<u>Read Mark 14:43-46</u>
<u>Station 3</u>	Jesus condemned	<u>Read Luke 22:66-71</u>
<u>Station 4</u>	Jesus is denied by Peter	<u>Read Matthew 26:69-75</u>
<u>Station 5</u>	Jesus is judged by Pilate	<u>Read Mark 15:1-5, 15</u>
<u>Station 6</u>	Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns	<u>Read John 19:1-3</u>
<u>Station 7</u>	Jesus bears the cross	<u>Read John 19:6, 15-17</u>
<u>Station 8</u>	Jesus is helped by Simon to carry the cross	<u>Read Mark 15:21</u>
<u>Station 9</u>	Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem	<u>Read Luke 23:27-31</u>
<u>Station 10</u>	Jesus is nailed to the cross	<u>Read Luke 23:33-34</u>
<u>Station 11</u>	Jesus promises His kingdom to the good thief	<u>Read Luke 23:39-43</u>
<u>Station 12</u>	Jesus speaks to His mother and the disciple	<u>Read John 19:25-27</u>
<u>Station 13</u>	Jesus dies on the cross; the veil is torn	<u>Read Luke 23:44-46</u>
<u>Station 14</u>	Jesus is placed in the tomb	<u>Read Matthew 27:57-60</u>
