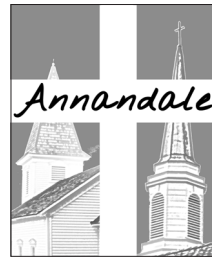

Sign up to help with our Food for Others pilot at the Mission Center: AUMC has partnered with Food for Others to provide emergency food assistance at our Mission Center (7901 Heritage Drive) on Tuesdays, 5–7 p.m. The pilot program begins **March 3** and runs through **June 30**. Volunteers who can lift 50 lbs. multiple times are needed 4–5 p.m. to unload the Food for Others truck. Volunteers are also needed 5–7:15 p.m. to assist those receiving food, carry items to vehicles and clean up. To help, use the sign-up form at annandalechurch.com/foodforothers/. Food for Others serves at-risk families referred by Fairfax County schools and social services. Many of the group’s clients live in the community around our Mission Center. Food is distributed by appointment, and Food for Others anticipates about 20 clients picking up food during the two-hour window.

Help kids with their homework at the Mission Center: Volunteers serve as tutors, readers and snack coordinators, and provide administrative assistance. Tutoring is on Wednesdays in the Mission Center fellowship hall, 3:45–5:45 p.m. We provide homework assistance to students in grades 1–9. We also need people who enjoy being read to by students. Our children’s clothing closet serves low-income residents who live near our Mission Center on Heritage Drive. If you would like to donate clothing to help our neighbors, we need clothes, shoes, coats, hats and gloves in all sizes from infant to teens. We also provide adults with winter coats, gloves and hats. Donations can be placed in the white wooden box under the coatrack near the parlor.
