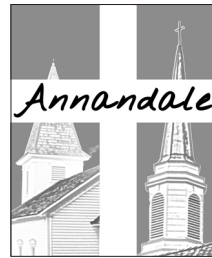

Food for Others serves at-risk families referred by Fairfax County schools and social services. Many of the clients live in the community around our Mission Center. Food is distributed by appointment, and Food for Others anticipates about 20 clients picking up food during the two-hour window.

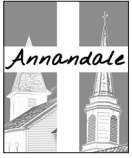
